The council drainage excavation work in View Point Rd has uncovered a large void under the kerb and channel that has been directing the continuous flow of water down View Point Rd to the cliff face seeps, which is exactly where the landslip occurred. These seeps were a contributing factor to the landslip (refer to the Geotechnical reports).

It is now clear the cracked kerb and channel coupled with the continuous flow of water has been a key contributor to the landslip of November 2022.

As I pay rates for drainage, I believe the lack of maintenance and response to the issue of continuous water running down View Point Rd over cracked kerb and channel changes the liability for hillside restitution to the Council.

The Geotechnical reports by Civiltest and Stantec had postulated this being a possible root cause.

Please consider and advise council's response.
