Hi Prerna,

See summary table below and ALS reports of the water samples collected and tested for 3 standard indicator parameters. My assessment of these results is that none of them reflect the typical measured parameter concentrations of the average throughout our potable water network (Avg. taken from 2024 WQ annual report). The closest was the sample taken in the stormwater drain in front of 6 View Point rd on 6 Jan but a follow up sample on 8 Jan was enough evidence to conclude that the water is highly unlikely to be potable water.
