Monitoring data

With monitoring continuing in the exclusion zone, please find attached displacement monitoring data for the period 12am 13 February to 11.59pm 27 February 2025. This data is from the GPS sensors, survey prisms, tilt sensors and radar.

Please note, this is raw data only for the period indicated above. We are unable to form opinions from this data as yet – it still needs to be analysed, interpreted and peer reviewed. Monitoring is continuing and more data is required.

Geotechnical update

- Dye trace testing
- □ Pile testing and critical monitoring for pile testing
- □ Installation of two additional GPS sensors
- Monitoring data release (see attached)
- □ Weekly survey of prisms

MBS resourcing update
