Good afternoon, all, Investigation update

We have started making contact with residents for consent for the geotechnical engineers to access properties for the investigation. Activities on sites may include drilling bores for ground water and taking soil samples. This work will commence in the week beginning 10 February, once consents have been received.

Security update
We were informed this afternoon by Victoria Police that the camera situated on Pt Nepean Rd has been redeployed to a festival in Frankston for this weekend. We are currently making enquiries with our CCTV camera/security provider for the installation of a camera at that location. We have confirmed that our security company is doing four (4) patrols each night. I have also spoken with the Senior Sergeant at Rosebud Police who has reaffirmed Victoria Police's commitment to patrolling the area.
