Residents update McCrae landslide recovery

Shire update

The focus this week has been on enabling more residents to access their properties and retrieve personal belongings. This is a high-risk undertaking, requiring significant resources, extensive preplanning and stringent safety protocols. For those residents currently unable to occupy their homes, we understand how important it is to be reunited with your belongings.

Another major focus this week has been supporting the Board of Inquiry investigation. We have now received several requests for documents and information and are working hard to ensure the Inquiry has everything it needs.

At the request of the Inquiry Chair, Renee Enbom KC, we made Dromana Community Hall available on Wednesday as a venue for her to informally meet with residents affected by the landslide. During her visit, Ms Enbom was also able to view the landslide site from outside the exclusion zone.

Geotechnical update

We are continuing to monitor the site and investigate the cause of the landslide. Our Geotech experts have finished their on-ground investigations for now and are into the report-writing stage of the process.

Works update

We will be carrying out preliminary work in the Coburn Avenue/Prospect Hill Road area next week, as part of preparations for the installation of piezometers in early May. You may see coloured paint on the road and nature strip. These paint marks indicate the type and depth of existing underground services and are required before excavation can take place.

The piezometers will be installed near or over the existing stormwater or sewer trenches and will contain sensors to measure water levels at defined intervals to assess groundwater flow in those areas.

We continue to work with South East Water (SEW), who have advised they will be carrying out CCTV assessment of the McCrae sewer network between April and June. SEW has also advised they will be exchanging analogue water meters for digital ones in McCrae from late April to June. New meters will not be installed at homes within the exclusion zone, however once the exclusion zone has been lifted, SEW will contact those homeowners individually to discuss.

Wellbeing support

We are acutely aware of the psychological impact of this crisis, not only as a result of the initial incident but also the inevitable period of uncertainty following. To assist, we had Red Cross and the Victorian Council of Churches Emergency Ministries attend community meetings in January and helped Red Cross directly contact evacuated residents who had returned to their homes in February.
